

Rooted in God's Love

The words of Psalm 11:3 ask the questions :"*When the foundations are shaken, what can the righteous do?*" One of the key things we need to do is find a secure place to stand, and dig secure foundations for our lives that will keep us in the shakiest of times. We do this by leaning in more and more to the One who NEVER changes. Study the following passages to find out how such a life is possible. Jesus has been teaching both his disciples and the crowds who are following Him. As He finishes He tells a parable.

Matthew 7:24-27

²⁴ "Everyone then who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock. ²⁵ And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on the rock. ²⁶ And everyone who hears these words of mine and does not do them will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand. ²⁷ And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell, and great was the fall of it."

PSALM 1

Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the wicked, nor stands in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of scoffers;

² but his delight is in the law of the Lord, and on his law he meditates day and night.

³ He is like a tree planted by streams of water, that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither. In all that he does, he prospers.

⁴ The wicked are not so, but are like chaff that the wind drives away.

⁵ Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgement, nor sinners in the congregation **of the** righteous; ⁶ for the LORD knows the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked will perish.

⁸ This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have good success.
