MAKE DISCIPLES: OBEDIENT

As we explore the "Great Commission" we discover that Jesus was setting a pattern for how the task of making disciples was to be accomplished. The call to deny ourselves and take up our cross would be profoundly symbolised in the act of being baptised in the name of Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and the call to follow Jesus would be lived out in an obedient life, governed by all that He has commanded us to do. However, the last thing on Jesus mind was dutiful service.

Matthew 28:18-20

¹⁸ And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.
¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.

Mark 12:28-31

²⁸ And one of the scribes came up and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well, asked him, "Which commandment is the most important of all?"

²⁹ Jesus answered, "The most important is, 'Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. ³⁰ And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' ³¹ The second is this: 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these."

Obeying all Jesus commands is not simply a case of keeping rules. This was not what God intended. The night before Jesus died he taught his disciples what obedience truly meant.

John 14:15-17

¹⁵ "If you love me, you will keep my commandments ¹⁶ And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you for ever, ¹⁷ even the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, for he dwells with you and will be in you.

Ezekiel 36:26-27

²⁶ And I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. And I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh.
²⁷ And I will put my Spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes and be careful to obey my rules.

John 14:21-26

²¹ Whoever has my commandments and keeps

them, he it is who loves me. And he who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and manifest myself to him." ²² Judas (not Iscariot) said to him, "Lord, how is it that you will manifest yourself to us, and not to the world?" ²³ Jesus answered him, "If anyone loves me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him. ²⁴ Whoever does not love me does not keep my words. And the word that you hear is not mine but the Father's who sent me. ²⁵ "These things I have spoken to you while I am still with you. ²⁶ But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you.

Jesus is in the upper room with his disciples and as he prepares to leave then, he shares truths that will help them in the days ahead.

Reflect on how this would look in your life.

V26 What is the role of the Holy Spirit in this? How does this relate to what we read in Ezekiel 36?

Jesus desire is intimacy with us and we are not left alone in this endeavour. We have the Spirit as our helper, prompting us and enabling us.

John 15:8-14

⁸ By this my Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so prove to be my disciples. 9 As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love. ¹⁰ If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. 11 These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full. 12 "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. ¹³ Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends ¹⁴ You are my friends if you do what I command you.

God's plan was us living in loving intimacy with Him as we lived lives of obedience. But often the fledgling church lost its focus. In Corinth there was an excessive focus on spiritual gifts.
