




<u>JONAH</u>. Last week we studied Chapter 1, and left him in the belly of a fish. Today, we are going to study Chapter 2 and see what happened to Jonah next. Look out for things you have never learnt before about Jonah as you study it for yourself.


What does the Lord do in verse 2?

Jonah's prayer in Chapter 2 uses many phrases and figures of speech from the Psalms. This shows that Jonah knew God's Word, and he knew it off by heart, because there was no Bible and no candle in the fish's belly.

What do you think He is starting to realise as he is praying to God?

LET'S HAVE A LOOK AT WHAT ELSE HE SAYS IN HIS PRAYER!



Let's look closely at the lines in red bold italics.

v3: WHO is Jonah saying hurled him into the sea?

Yes the sailors threw him physically overboard as we learnt last week but Jonah realised that it was God who did it.


v4: What do you think Jonah means when he says '*I have been banished from your sight*'? Do you think this means he felt close to God or far from God?

v4: What does Jonah then do, WHO has Jonah remembered in the fish's belly?

v6: Jonah prays, *But you, Lord my God, brought my life up from the pit.* Remind me where Jonah is? ______ So what does Jonah mean?

Jonah felt separated from God in the belly, but he then prays like God has already answered His prayer and brought him out, even though he is still there. Jonah could praise God for the answer to prayer before the answer came, because God gave him assurance.

v9: How do you think Jonah is feeling in verse 9 and what is he saying to God? Do you think He was sorry? What was Jonah going to do now for God? Who was looking after Jonah the whole time?



So 'what/who' does this verse tell us that God had control over?

Do you think the fish decided to swallow Jonah by itself in the first place?



Jonah caused a lot of trouble for himself. When you think about it, sometimes we are not much different from Jonah. We aren't going to run away and hide at the bottom of a ship, get thrown overboard and then get swallowed by a huge fish like Jonah did, but sometimes we maybe try to hide from God when we are scared, when we have gone our own way and just don't want to do what God says.

I wonder have you ever done something wrong - like fight with your bother of sister or break something and blame someone else, or not done as you have been told to do - and then tried to cover it up or go hide in your room and hope that your mum or dad wouldn't find out or get cross? If you have ever done that did, you were acting just like Jonah. It doesn't do any good to hide does it? Sooner or later you have to face up to what you did. **You may be able to hide things from your parents and friends, but you definitely can't hide them from God. The Bible says, "Nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight." (Hebrews 4:13.)**


When you are scared about something, instead of running away and hiding, God wants you to come to him and ask him for strength to face up to your fears. And when you do something wrong, instead of trying to forget about it, or hiding from it, God wants you to tell him about it, and to ask him for forgiveness. The Bible tells us that, "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins." (1 John 1:9.) So instead of trying to hide your sins from God, tell God what you did wrong and he will forgive you. – Why don't you try and learn that verse!
