Know God Deeply Presence

One of the greatest maladies of our time is loneliness. Despite being connected 24 hours a day through social media, and having many ways to communicate, there is a deep need in the human soul to be known, loved and wanted. With the restrictions due to the pandemic, this sense of aloneness has been heightened. As we get to know God deeply we discover that His children are never abandoned or alone.

The "ark" was behind a curtain, the veil, so no-one could go in to the immediate presence of God, only the High Priest, and that was just once a year. Sin was still the problem that separated God from us.
